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- **UPDATED FAMILY CARE EXPANSION TIMELINE**

An updated Family Care expansion timeline has been developed. The new timeline takes into account the funding levels proposed by Governor Doyle in his 2009-11 biennial budget proposal. The timeline could change based on any budget amendments that are approved by the Legislature.
